### Servant Leadership

3. Energize the safety meetings with valuable input
4. Are their brother's keeper - has everyone's back
5. Put safety before profit - safety has no price
6. Grow and mentor other safety leaders
7. Treat people with dignity and respect

### Key Points:

- ◆ Positive reinforcement drives profit...period (Harvard Business Review)
- ◆ Number one driver for productivity - my boss cares about me
- ◆ Sign of a committed and engaged employee - I want to do it (i.e. the task)

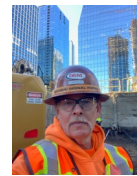

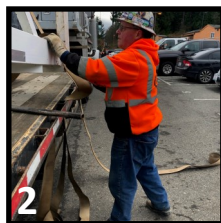
- Improve upon use of lagging PPE: face-shields, chaps and safety supplies, avoid Class 3 contaminated soils
